GREEN FLAG AWARD JUDGING Monday 5th June

Litter Picking Event

The long-awaited morning of the litter pick finally arrived. The council had delivered the picky-uppy things, the gloves and plenty of bags and once kitted out we set off in various directions as directed by our co-ordinators for the day. For those who wanted, there were even some bright bright yellow tabards to put on to give an extra air of importance and authority.





It was a wonderful response, around 25 volunteers, including quite a few young people, turned up, plus 15 from the local scout troop, which may be a record attendance. As expected, the park had been well prepared beforehand with suitable litter and rubbish, and there was certainly no shortage of things to pick up.

Whilst no official research was undertaken, once again the main items seemed to be food packaging of one form or another, including a varied selection of plastic drink containers. Little carrier bags of dog poo were quite 'poplar', but glass alcoholic beverage bottles were thought to be down this year.



At the end, we'd collected over 30 bags for the council to collect. Fantastic, and a higher number than usual, but remember we hadn't done a 'pick' for some time. The scouts were highly enthusiastic and were greatly appreciated, so thanks go to their leader, David, for allowing them to 'volunteer'.

As usual, it is a shame that it must be done at all, but if we didn't do this then it would just mount up, not good for the woodland, us, the park visitors or for the animal, bird and insect life. Again, the worst area was by the pathway alongside Longsands school, but perhaps that was due to the prevailing wind blowing the litter all the way from the car park...or some other reason...who can say.

But I think all those who attended can now pat themselves on the back, if they can reach, and feel a well-deserved smugness. And we even gained a few new members on the day. A result!



Update

We are pleased to announce that Huntingdonshire District Council have submitted their Portfolio for the Green Flag Award status for Priory Park and we have been informed that the judging will take place on Monday 5th June.

You will notice as you walk around the park that HDC are hard at work completing the identified improvements and we must say that works undertaken so far look great!

Works to the main entrance are well underway with the reconfiguration of the parking bays and relocation of the notice board to a more suitable location. The construction of planters and better signage at this location is a vast improvement to the entrance.





A considerable amount of tree work has also been carried out over the last few months and we were pleased to see that some of the woodchip generated was recycled and spread on the woodland path.
